

The Blue Ridge region is truly one of the most musical places on Earth. The Blue Ridge Music Center honors and celebrates the living musical heritage of the surrounding mountains and interprets its significance within the larger landscape of American music and culture.

For generations, small rural communities in the mountains have produced an abundance of remarkable traditional musicians, dancers, and instrument makers who have become keepers of a legacy rooted in the rhythms of African banjo and the melodies of the European violin. The region created and maintains a wellspring of old-time, bluegrass, and mountain gospel sounds that have profoundly influenced the development of American music.

The Music Center's mission is to document and interpret the traditional musical forms of the Blue Ridge Mountains, offer opportunities for people to hear this music, and learn about the cultural context from which it emerged.

The Music Center is also a portal to the region, introducing visitors to the many musical and cultural attractions in Blue Ridge Parkway gateway communities.

# ROOTS OF AMERICAN MUSIC MUSEUM

Open daily · 10 A.M. - 5 P.M. · Free

At the Blue Ridge Music Center, the Roots of American Music Museum tells the compelling story of the region's rich musical heritage. This year, the Music Center was ranked No. 4 in a list of the Top 10 free museums in the country by *USA Today* readers.

Visitors can enjoy songs and stories while learning about the significance of this intriguing aspect of mountain culture. Stop in to mix and match lyrics, create mountain music, and hear personal stories of how music has influenced generations of families in the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Visitors will see examples of the evolution of the five string banjo since its arrival in North America with enslaved Africans. They can learn how European immigrants brought the fiddle to



the Appalachian frontier. The blending of these two instruments was the beginning of virtually all forms of American music. There are also oral history programs of those who collected the music of the mountains. A key element of the story is how the recording industry and radio popularized and changed mountain music.

The Lonesome River Band is one of the most respected names in bluegrass music. Led by renowned banjo player Sammy Shelor, the group is constantly breaking new ground in acoustic music. With two stellar lead vocalists, Jesse Smathers (guitar) and Adam Miller (mandolin), and the impressive talents of Mike Hartgrove (fiddle) and Kameron Keller (bass), the band seamlessly fuses instrumentals and harmony vocals, traditional and contemporary bluegrass sounds.

Scythian (sith-ee-yin) began more than 12 years ago as a bunch of college buddies playing Celtic music in the streets. The group has grown to become a headliner at Celtic and bluegrass-Americana festivals. Their brand of high-energy folk music found a resonance that led *The Washington Post* to write: "Scythian's enthusiasm is contagious, and shows seem to end with everyone dancing, jumping around or hoisting glasses." They have played more than 1,300 shows across the United States, Europe, Canada, and Australia.

The group was founded by brothers Alexander and Danylo Fedoryka, who are first-generation sons of Ukrainian immigrants. From the start, Scythian has been a search and love for the

Watchhouse, formerly Mandolin Orange, is an Americana-folk duo featuring Andrew Marlin (vocals, mandolin, guitar, banjo) and Emily Frantz (vocals, violin, guitar). The duo weaves Appalachian-steeped folk into earnest songwriting, and capture audiences through the interplay of storytelling and harmony singing.

Over the past decade, they have released six albums as Mandolin Orange. Under the new name, they produced a self-titled album in 2021, a recording that reflects their new direction and intentions as a band.

**Opening:** Alexa Rose was born in the Alleghany Highlands of Virginia and raised in a tiny Appalachian railroad town. The musical legacy and storytelling spirit of the mountains are woven



into her voice and songwriting. Her debut album, *Medicine For Living*, is a multilayered Americana merger of old country music and traditional folk songs.

# MICHAEL CLEVELAND & FLAMEKEEPER

From an early age, Michael Cleveland heard old-time and bluegrass music at local jams and festivals near his hometown of Henryville, Indiana, inspiring him to take up the fiddle at age four. Cleveland began playing professionally after high school, and in 2006, he formed Flamekeeper, a group that has won the International Bluegrass Music Association's (IBMA) Instrumental Group of the Year award seven times.

Cleveland has been recognized 12 times as the IBMA's Fiddler of the Year, was inducted into the National Fiddlers' Hall of Fame, and won a Grammy for his album *Tall Fiddler*. In 2022, the National Endowment for the Arts named him a Heritage Fellow, the United States' highest honor in the folk and traditional arts.



**Opening:** The Crooked Road Ramblers are an old-time band steeped in the traditional music of the Blue Ridge Mountains. The group performs a mixture of instrumental dance music, old ballads, and traditional country and bluegrass songs.

A Tennessee-raised singer, songwriter, and instrumentalist, Amythyst Kiah cuts across genres. Her diverse taste in artists spans the likes of pop icons such as Micheal Jackson and Tori Amos, as well as classic country artists Jimmy Rogers and the Carter Family. When combined with the transcendent quality of her voice, what emerges is an extraordinary vessel for Kiah's musical expression and songwriting. Her standout song "Black Myself" earned a Grammy nomination for Best American Roots Song and won Song of the Year at the 2019 Folk Alliance International Awards. With her Rounder Records debut, Wary + Strange, she has toured in Europe and the United States.

### SAM BUSH BAND

Sam Bush, aka The Father of Newgrass, is known as one of the liveliest performers around. Inspired by the pioneering progressive bluegrass band the New Deal String Band and their rock-flavored approach to bluegrass, Sam Bush formed the New Grass Revival in 1972. Over the next 17 years, he and the band revolutionized the music of the hill country, incorporating everything from gospel and reggae to rock and modern jazz into their tradition-rooted sound.

After a quarter-century of making music with New Grass Revival and collaborating with other bands, Bush, went solo. He's released seven albums and a live DVD over the past two decades. In 2009, the Americana Music Association awarded Bush the Lifetime Achievement Award for Instrumentalist. The Punch Brothers, Steep Canyon Rangers, and Greensky Bluegrass are just a few present-day bluegrass vanguards he's influenced.

Jeff Little is an award-winning musician from the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina. As a true music innovator, he gives the piano a prominent role in Americana and Appalachian music that is very rarely seen.

The Jeff Little Trio includes Steve Lewis and Luke Little. Lewis is an award-winning guitar and banjo player from Todd, N.C., and is one of the most respected acoustic musicians in the country. Luke is a young and talented mandolin player whose musicianship and style expand well beyond his years.

Opening: DaShawn Hickman, from Mount Airy, N.C., is one of today's foremost players of Sacred Steel, a blues-gospel tradition started in the Pentecostal-Holiness churches of the 1930s. He grew up hearing pedal steel in the tiny House of God church his family attended, and listening to his mother play lap steel at home. Hickman, along with his vocalist wife, Wendy, and bass player Charlie Hunter have put their own spin on Sacred Steel, and love to share their soulful sound.

Rissi Palmer made her mark in country music, yet she is equally at home in R&B, bringing the entire spectrum of popular music to bear on music she calls "Southern Soul."

As a passionate voice for country artists of color and those who have been marginalized in mainstream country music, Palmer launched her radio show *Color Me Country with Rissi Palmer* on Apple Music Country in 2020. The program treats listeners to in-depth conversations with artists of color, including Brittney Spencer, Cam, Chapel Hart, Crystal Shawanda, Maren Morris, Miko Marks, The War and Treaty, Darius Rucker and Mickey Guyton, and Andrea Williams.



**Opening:** Martha Bassett's beautiful altovoice radiates as she performs in a wide array of musical genres, including jazz, folk, and country gospel. As a guitarist, vocalist, and songwriter, her solid stage presence captivates audiences. She is also the host of the *Martha Bassett Show*, a popular monthly radio program that features her as band leader and curator.

With her spellbinding voice and time-bending sensibilities, Sierra Ferrell makes music that's as fantastically vagabond as the artist herself. Growing up in small-town West Virginia, the singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist left home in her early 20s to journey across the country with a troupe of nomadic musicians, playing everywhere from truck stops to alleyways to boxcars speeding down the railroad tracks.

After years of living in her van and busking on the streets of New Orleans and Seattle, she moved to Nashville and soon landed a deal with Rounder Records. On her label debut *Long Time Coming*, Ferrell shares songs that instantly transport her audience to an infinitely more



enchanted world.

"I want my music to be like my mind is — all over the place," she says. "I listen to everything from bluegrass to techno to goth metal, and it all inspires me in different ways that I try to incorporate into my songs and make people really feel something." Ferrell joined forces with a knockout lineup of guest musicians, adding entirely new texture to each of her gracefully crafted and undeniably heartfelt songs.

### JOHN R. MILLER + CALEB CAUDLE

John R. Miller is a guitarist, singer, and songwriter whose music has the earthy twang of country, the late-night feel of blues, and the road-worn defiance of rock & roll.

When he was 14, he taught himself to play guitar. Starting with punk rock, he switched direction during a brief stint in college, discovering traditional West Virginia fiddle music, and taking an interest in folk and country singer-songwriters.

His latest recording, *Depreciated*, was released in 2021 to glowing accolades, including from roots music favorite Tyler Childers, who says Miller is "a well-traveled wordsmith mapping out the world he's seen, three chords at a time."

**Opening:** Caleb Caudle's songs weave their way into the listener's life, embracing the vast spectrum of emotion between the joy and sadness of our shared experiences. His catalog is a soundtrack to weddings, births, funerals, first dates, road trips, family reunions, and long afternoons spent on the porch.

The Kody Norris Show's sound and energy channel the instrumental virtuosity of the legendary Bill Monroe, the showmanship of the "King of Bluegrass" Jimmy Martin, the vocal harmonies of the Stanley Brothers, and a bit of the over-the-top comedy entertainment of vaudeville performances. Top-notch picking is center stage, but humor and visual flash are part of the package.

The foursome is fronted by Norris on guitar and his fiddling "sweetie," Mary Rachel Nalley-Norris, with Josiah Tyree on banjo, and Cousin Charlie Lowman on bass. The group's album, When I Get the Money Made, was named the 2017 Bluegrass Album of the Year by the National Traditional Country Music Association. In 2022, Nalley-Norris won Fiddle Performer of the Year, and The Kody Norris Show earned the Entertainer of the Year title from the organization.

**Opening:** The Slate Mountain Ramblers is a old-time family band from Mount Airy, N.C. For many years, Richard Bowman, his wife, Barbara, and their daughter Marsha, have spent weekends traveling across Northwest North Carolina and Southwest Virginia playing music for dances, concerts, community events, and fiddlers' conventions.


## **DOC AT 100**

DOC AT 100 explores the history and legacy of Doc Watson, who was born in Deep Gap, N.C., in 1923, and went on to become perhaps the most influential acoustic guitarist in the world of folk music. The show will include remembrances of Doc with special stories, and feature the many powerful songs that he played and recorded during his career.

Hosted by author Ted Olson, the concert program celebrates the life and legacy of Watson by artists who were profoundly influenced by his music, and who called him a friend. This includes T. Michael Coleman and Jack Lawrence, who performed, recorded, and toured with Doc longer



than any other musicians he worked with. Joining Coleman and Lawrence are fellow guitarists Wayne Henderson and Jack Hinshelwood, who were both heavily impacted by Doc's music. In his later years, Watson enjoyed visiting Henderson in his luthier shop in Rugby, Va.

Joe Troop and Larry Bellorín are versatile multiinstrumentalists and singer-songwriters on a mission to show that music has no borders. They perform a fusion of Venezuelan and Appalachian folk music on harp, banjo, cuatro, fiddle, guitar, and maracas.

Bellorín grew up in Punta de Mata in the state of Monagas, Venezuela. By age six, he became a shoe shiner and built a faithful clientele by singing as he polished, taking requests for the popular Vallenatos of the day. He eventually caught the attention of a local music educator who invited him to study at the city's premiere music school. In 2012, he left Venezuela for the United States when his home country began to collapse.

Troop is a multi-instrumentalist, singer, and



songwriter from Winston-Salem, N.C. His music is deeply inspired by his decade living in Buenos Aires and traveling across Latin America.

**Opening:** Shay Martin Lovette is a Boone, N.C.-based songwriter and musician. After growing up in nearby Wilkes County, he draws from his admiration for the rich musical traditions of his home region to craft originals like "Parkway Bound." In 2019, Lovette and his backing band won the band competition at MerleFest.

# AN EVENING WITH STEEP CANYON RANGERS

The Steep Canyon Rangers are Grammy winners, perennial Billboard chart-toppers, and frequent collaborators of the renowned banjoist (and occasional comedian) Steve Martin.

The band started in college at UNC-Chapel Hill, then dove head first into bluegrass in its most traditional form. Over the years, they have risen to the top of the bluegrass genre headlining festivals such as MerleFest and Grey Fox Bluegrass. Their collaboration with Martin has taken the group on tour, helping to make the Steep Canyon Rangers one of the most recognizable modern names in bluegrass music.

The group released three albums in 2020. The Grammy-nominated *North Carolina Songbook* is a recording of their live 2019 performance at MerleFest. The studio album *Be Still Moses* paired



the band with soul legends Boyz II Men and their hometown Asheville Symphony to overhaul the song "Be Still Moses." The album includes re-imagined versions of Steep Canyon Rangers' previously released original songs performed with an orchestra. Their most recent release of all original music is titled *Arm in Arm*.

All the group's members contribute vocals and are Graham Sharp on banjo, Mike Guggino on mandolin/mandola, Aaron Burdett on guitar, Nicky Sanders on fiddle, Mike Ashworth on drums, and Barrett Smith on bass and guitar.



#### **Galax & New River Trail**

#### Dinner, drinks & music in Galax

#### **Shopping in Galax**

#### **Trout Fishing**



### TRAILS AT THE BLUE RIDGE MUSIC CENTER

#### **Trailhead Parking**

Hikers are asked to park at the trailhead on Foothills Road (State Route 612). On the Parkway, follow signs to the Music Center, turn into the entrance, then turn right onto Foothills Road just before the facility gates. Continue a half mile to the parking area.

#### **High Meadow Trail**

1.35 miles one-way. Easy

This leg-stretcher trek takes hikers through a hayfield, wetland, and forest with an abundance of wildflowers and birds. Two junctions for the Fisher Peak Loop join this trail. You may turn onto the loop trail, follow the High Meadow Trail to go to the Visitor Center, or return to the trailhead from these points. This route is a Kids in Parks TRACK Trail, which is part of

a nationwide network of trails designed to engage children with the outdoors. Before exploring the trail, families can pick up a brochure or download several e-Adventures to an electronic device to use along the trek. The e-activities include bug and flower identifications and forest bathing. After the hike, kids can register their adventure online to earn prizes. To learn more, visit KidsinParks.com.

#### Fisher Peak Loop

2.24-mile loop. Moderate

Begin this trail at one of its junctions with the High Meadow Trail and wind up Fisher Peak. The path follows a stream. In May and June, Catawba rhododendron provide a spectacular floral display.


